M.Sc. in Clinical Neuropsychiatry

This course is aimed at clinicians and academics from all disciplines with a particular interest in neuropsychiatry.

It is taught part-time over a period of two years (usually one afternoon per week during term time).

Each module is examined separately through essay writing, written case presentation or written exam.

Students complete a dissertation in the final year of the course.

Subject areas covered

- Basic neuroscience & philosophy
- Research methods
- Neuropsychiatry of epilepsy
- Neurodegenerative disorders
- Brain injury
- Sleep disorders
- Conversion & somatisation disorders
- Motor disorders

Students can also exchange modules with the other M.Sc. courses at Birmingham University including;

- Forensic Psychiatry
- Child and Family Mental Health
- Substance Abuse
- Learning Disability
- Old Age Psychiatry
